For the past three years, Holy Infant's PSR students have participated in Operation Christmas Child which is part of Samaritan's Purse. Simple, gift -filled shoe boxes are prepared by the students to let hurting boys and girls across the world know that they are loved and not forgotten. Since 1993, more than 100 million boys and girls in over 130 countries have received one of these shoeboxes filled with gifts. Since Holy Infant began its participation, it has prepared over 1,000 shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child.

For over 40 years, Samaritan's Purse has done their utmost to follow Christ's command to be Good Samaritans by going to the aid of the world's poor, sick, and suffering. They specialize in meeting critical needs of victims throughout the world by providing food,

medicine, and other assistance to those suffering conflict, disaster, famine, and epidemics. The organization's president is Franklin Graham, son of Christian evangelist Billy Graham.

Each child can fill a specially provided shoebox or

they can decorate their own shoebox or a plastic container. The child will determine if the gift will be for a girl or a boy, and pick the age category: 2 -4, 5 - 9, or 10 - 14. Then the fun begins. They fill the box with new items that a boy or girl

would love to have. Toy cars, Barbie dolls, balls, school supplies, toothbrushes, bar soap and combs are some of the things that could be put into the box. Some boxes could include

socks, hats, sunglasses,





hair clips; anything a child of that age would like. (Things that contain liquids, toy guns, knives, or military figures or glass items are not permitted.) Many of the children

enclose a note telling the child who receives their box where they live and something about themselves.

These boxes are then distributed overseas by volunteers. Since 1993, more than 100 million boys and girls in over 130 countries have experienced God's love through the power of simple shoebox gifts from Operation Christmas Child. Samaritan's Purse works with local churches and ministry partners to deliver the gifts and share the life-changing Good News of Jesus Christ.

Holy Infant is participating again in 2016. Boxes are being prepared now to deliver to local churches to ship where they are needed. Anyone can prepare boxes for the organization. More information is available on their website.



not wait to return one day."





Virtue-Based Restorative Discipline

When I was in grade school, I remember staying inside for recess writing, "I will not talk in class" one hundred times. Holy Infant School takes a different approach to discipline. All grades at Holy Infant School use the Virtue-Based Restorative Discipline (VBRD) program, a program based on the word "virtue," a holy habit that imitates God.



VBRD, developed by Lynne Lang, Director of School Climate at the Archdiocese of St. Louis, and pioneered by several area grade schools, has the following guiding principles:

All people make mistakes and need an opportunity to make up for the harm done and return to full acceptance in a community.

Everyone in a restorative system must commit to being positive, which means dwelling on the positive rather than the negative.

Virtue is the opposite/positive aspect of harm and needs to be taught and developed.

Prayer must be a part of discipline in a Catholic environment. (www.holytrinity-stann.org)

Mrs. McQuaide, principal of Holy Infant School, explains that the program is a proactive way to discipline by focusing on the goodness in the students and stressing Christ-like actions. Rather than punish wrongdoing, VBRD gets to the heart of the problem that caused it, how an action causes harm to another and how students should address it in a constructive way, free of negativity. (http://stlouisreview.com/article/2016-06-23/virtue-based) VBRD "is a way of dealing with discipline issues by focusing on the virtue(s) that the student needs to practice. Every other Monday, students take part in circle meetings with their homeroom. The teacher focuses on a virtue and the students complete some type of project

or activity that incorporates that virtue," she adds. The circle meetings are opportunities to share and ask questions, in a judgement free zone. There are no "dumb questions", no right or wrong answers, just an invitation to share and learn.

The school focuses on four virtues each year, one per quarter. For the 2016-2017 school year, the virtues are empathy, peace,

prudence, and fortitude. During the Advent season,



they are focusing on the virtue of peace. "We are discussing peace in our world, in our homes, and in our classrooms," she explains. Along with discussing the virtue of peace, the classrooms will participate in ser-

vice projects to learn about living out the virtues in their everyday lives. The classrooms are collecting needed items that will be donated to Our Lady's Inn, Guardian Angel Settlement, and inner city Catholic Schools.
