

Fr. Thomas Vordtriede was born to Lois and David Vordtriede on October 14, 1987.

His mother died when he was only 16 months old. Five vears later, his Dad remarried his good friend, Beth. They had two daughters, Carly (17 years old) and Victoria (12 years old).

It was there that he had experienced the overwhelming size of high school life. He often sought out the beautiful chapel in the middle of the school. It was such a peaceful retreat and he found himself praying "Why God, this life is too hard for me."

It wasn't till his junior year at SLUH that he started thinking "What college should I attend? Maybe I'll teach Religion - I so love God and I want the world to
