


One Lucky Person

A worthy scribe once remarked that there are countless interesting stories lurking about in our world, often in unusual places, waiting only to be discovered by some lucky person.

Whether the scribe was correct or not, I was definitely a lucky person the day I cleaned the glove



compartment of my old car. I found a small book titled "Scriptural Rosary" hidden amidst the clutter and debris. Being well acquainted with the Rosary but having never heard of a "Scriptural" one, I was intrigued; my cleaning task forgotten and I settled down to explore my find.

The little book described itself "The Scriptural Rosary - A Modern Version of the Way the Rosary was Once Prayed throughout Western Europe in the Late Middle Ages". I found that a Rosary prayed in those times included a prayer or meditation thought before each Hail Mary bead.

But the Rosary in my little book has more to offer. In place of prayers or meditation before each Rosary bead, the Scriptural Rosary draws its Hail Mary thoughts directly from the inspired writings of the New and Old Testaments. These Bible quotations are blended together to tell the story of each Mystery in ten consecutive thoughts. When a Scriptural Rosary is prayed, a Bible quotation, specific to the particular Mystery being prayed, is read before each Hail Mary bead. In this way when one has read the ten Scripture quotations and prayed the

ten Hail Mary beads of a Mystery, one will also have read the Bible story of that Mystery. .

What a wonderful way to pray the Rosary and read Scripture at the same time! Father Albert Shamon puts it this way:. "The Hail Mary's of the Rosary are like background music while you are watching our Lord's life."

The little book ends by saying "If this modern version of the old 15th century Rosary serves to improve the quality of the meditations of a few hundred people in the 20th century, then this book will have fulfilled its objectives handsomely".

It is my joy now to pray the Scriptural Rosary daily, and I am truly happy to have been one of the worthy scribe's "Lucky Persons".

INTERESTING INSIGHT FOR THE YEAR OF PRAYER PRETZELS AND PRAYER

Pretzels have an interesting history! There are two popular stories. One, as an incentive for children to learn to say their prayers, a monk, around the year 610 AD, decided to make a treat. In those days, Christians prayed by folding their hands across their chests with each hand touching the opposite shoulder. This monk decided to shape the dough so that it would look like hands folded in prayer. This shaped dough treat was called the "pretiola", which in Latin means, "little reward." The other story has the pretzels dating back as far as 300 AD during the Roman Empire. During Lent, people would make small breads of water, flour and salt and shape them in the form of crossed arms, like they would do while praying. They would call this bread, bracellae, which translated from the Latin, means, bracelet"or bracchiola, little arms."Later, the Germans would later call it, "brezel," based on these Latin words.
