

## RECIPE OF THE MONTH - Graham Cracker Bars

These were a favorite at our March meeting. These can be made ahead and frozen.

# Ingredients

- 2 sticks butter
- ½ cup sugar
- Graham crackers (approx. 56)
- Chopped nuts (optional)
- Vanilla Almond Bark (2 squares)



- 1. Boil butter and sugar for 3 minutes
- 2. Line a cookie sheet with sides with foil and spray generously with PAM cooking spray
- Break graham crackers in half and half again. (TIP: Older graham crackers are easier to break)
- 4. Set crackers side by side on lined cookie sheet
- 5. Pour butter/sugar mixture over crackers
- 6. Sprinkle with chopped nuts
- 7. Bake 10 minutes at 325 degrees
- 8. Remove and let sit 1-2 minutes
- Remove each cookie from sheet and place on parchment paper, wax paper or foil to cool
- Melt almond bark and drizzle over each cookie (TIP: if too thick thin with a little paraffin wax or Crisco.
- 11. Drizzle with melted butter until moistened
