RECIPE OF THE MONTH – Zucchíní Italían -Style By: Mary Jane Zust

Ingredients 6 small zucchini (about 1 and 1/2 lbs.) 1/8 teaspoon salt 2 tablespoons bottled Italian salad dressing 1/8 teaspoon Italian herb seasoning Grated Parmesan cheese.

Cut unpared zucchini in half crosswise, then length-wise into fourths. Place salt and zucchini slices in 1 and 1/2 quart casserole; sprinkle lightly with salad dressing and herb seasoning. Cover and microwave on high (100%) 3 minutes; stir. Cover and microwave until tender, 2 to 3 minutes longer. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese and paprika, if desired.
