Corpus Christi: Adoring and Proclaiming the Body of Christ in the Eucharist By Mary Sturm

#### Adoring the Body of Christ in the Eucharist

Pope Saint John Paul II opened a Perpetual Adoration in Rome on December 12, 1981, saying that when enough people came before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, abortion would end once and for all, there would be peace on earth, and the whole world would return to the true Light of the Gospel. He called for prolonged hours of adoration in every parish, even unceasingly.

Archbishop Justin Rigali wrote a letter on January 1, 1998 to all the pastors of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis, urging them to promote Eucharistic adoration in every parish to increase of vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life.

That year at Holy Infant, with the blessings of Monsignor Jerome Buchheit, Mrs. Gerry Dolan organized the Perpetual Eucharistic adoration on June 14, 1998 with more than 500 parishioners committing to a weekly hour adoring Our Lord in the Eucharist. Holy Infant's first Corpus Christi procession was held the following year on June 1, 1999.

Twenty years after its inception, Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration still flourishes at Holy Infant, due to our parishioners' devotion to our Eucharistic Lord. We are excited that the 20th Anniversary of Holy Infant Eucharistic Adoration is fast approaching!!



#### Proclaiming the Body of Christ in the Eucharist

"And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that those who believe in him may not perish, but may have life everlasting." - The Gospel of John Lifting up Jesus Christ to the public.....showing our faith that the Eucharist is Jesus, and worthy of our adoration outside the church walls as well as inside. How often do we do this? How often do we seize the opportunity?

The feast of Corpus Christi is a special time when our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is exposed not just to faithful Catholics but to all the world. This is a time when Catholics can show their love for Christ in the Real Presence by honoring Him in a very public way. It is also a wonderful means by which we can show our love for our neighbors by bringing Our Lord and Savior closer to them.

Corpus Christi processions date back to the 14th century. They are still held on the Feast of Corpus Christi throughout the world, often with the regal splendor and rich traditions of years past.

Holy Infant will be honoring Jesus Christ in the Eucharist with the Corpus Christi Procession on June 2nd after the 4pm Mass to continue a glorious tradition for our parish. Please join the Knights of Columbus and other Holy Infant parishioners. You will have the opportunity to walk the area around Holy Infant in procession with the Blessed Sacrament proclaiming your faith and love of our Lord to our community. We will end with a BBQ and ice cream social in the Upper Cafeteria.

In an Apostolic letter, Pope St. John Paul II urged all Catholics to participate in Corpus Christi processions as a public profession of their faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament.

Come and experience your Savior and be inspired as you have never before when you join us in the Corpus Christi Procession on June 2nd.

#### August 7, 2018 Primary Election

June 26 Absentee opens for the August 7th Primary Election. Saturday absentee voting times vary. Check the website for each election

July 11 Last day to register for the August 7th Primary Election.

August 1 Last day (5:00 p.m.) absentee applications will be accepted through the mail or in person from a guardian or relative of the applicant for the August 7th Primary Election.

August 4 Office open (times optional) for absentee voting in the August 7th Primary Election. Saturday absentee voting times vary. Check the website for each election.

August 6 Last day (5:00 p.m.) for voting an absentee ballot in person at the Election Board office for the August 7th Primary Election.

August 7 **ELECTION DAY**, Polls open from 6:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

The August election is a primary which means you have to tell the election officials which party ballot you want. If you need help getting an absentee ballot please let me know. <u>REMEMBER</u> the election office moved to the old Famous Barr/Macy building, lower floor at Northwest Plaza. RECIPE OF THE MONTH - Chicken Pasta with Pink Sauce

#### Ingredients:

- 4 chicken breasts grilled
- 1 lb of bow tie or shell pasta (cooked and drained)
- 1 family size jar of Prego Alfredo sauce
- 1 regular size jar of Prego Red sauce
- 2 cups mozzarella cheese

Brown chicken in fry pan and cool. Cut into bite size pieces. Add the 2 jars of Prego sauce to the chicken and simmer till flavors blend. Add the cooked pasta to the sauce and stir. Pour all into a baking dish and sprinkle mozzarella cheese on top. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 35 minutes or until heated through. Serve with additional parmesan cheese and garlic bread.
