THE HISTORY OF HOLY INFANT SENIORS—SEPT. 2017--JUNE 2018 By: Mary Mallery, HIS Historian

On Sept. 7, 2017 vice president Joan Wojciechowski, taking the place of president Tom Arnold, welcomed 104 seniors to the opening of the 21st year of our organization. She introduced officers for the year: Marilyn Tarleton as secretary and Tom Dollus as Treasurer. The rest of the Board presented short updates of their jobs.

Our Sept. meeting got off to a good start when Joan introduced a Treasure Hunt game that Mary Weman created during the summer. From finding a member with a tattoo, one with the most grandchildren, to one who has met a celebrity, etc. seniors were enjoying meeting, sharing with one another, and scrambling about the cafeteria to get the most answers for a prize. What fun!

As program planner, Joan continued through the year to give us varied programs. In Oct. she introduced a holocaust survivor, Siegfried Adler, who gave us a picture of the Nazi regime so vividly.

November saw us sampling wine with food pairings presented be Stacy Seipp from Ballwin Schnucks. A presentation by Ballwin police officers Steve Dahn and Michael Morrison on safety in crowds was time appropriate. On this website you can obtain information on upcoming elections including how to request an Absentee Ballot with related information and how to obtain a copy of your Sample Ballot. Sample Ballots are available closer to the election date. This past election, the Board opened two temporary satellite offices and one was in our area at the Clarkson Wilson Centre (74 Clarkson Wilson Centre, Chesterfield MO 63017), just North of Marquette High School. As the next election nears, I will know when they will be opened and what they will take care of.

The Election Board is ALWAYS looking for people to help on election day. This is a paid position. You can also get an application blank and information on the three positions on their website.
