It's been a LOOOONG 17 months with not much happening to so much happening. During lockdown, I was sleeping in every day until around 9am. At first, I thought I'd do the things I never get time to do, but heck, who was I kidding? Both Bob and I are retired and could do anything we want whenever we want to, anyway. We put puzzles together and learned how to play Backgammon. We did try to walk everyday either outside or at the Chesterfield Mall in bad weather. I think I missed daily mass the most but once they started livestreaming, I was able to 'attend' 8am mass. I'm sure others felt the same as me, I still missed receiving the eucharist. Once we were able to go back to church 'live' I was up again at 5:15, taking an afternoon nap.

Our bubble consisted of my brother Mark and the two of us. With him being sick, we were his only contact. How would you like your only contact to be me and Bob? All of his doctor appointments were on-line and we took him to get his blood drawn once a month. The Multiple Myeloma seemed to be under control, and he'd sit in the car when we shopped for him and in the park sketching trees he found interesting. Unfortunately, 6 months into the lockdown, Mark got remarkably worse in a very short amount of time and within 8 days passed away on September 5th, 2020 from Small Cell Lung Cancer. It was a blessing as it was quick and not as painful as the Multiple Myeloma would have been for him. We were finally able to have a memorial mass for him over July 4th when my sister from Houston was able to come in. On the day he died, my siblings gathered at his house and saw a huge bunch of butterflies rise out of a bush in his garden. We really miss him, but I find comfort in seeing butterflies almost daily. I want to thank all of you for your prayers and masses on his behalf and appreciate the comfort of your kind words and thoughts throughout his sickness.
