NEW H.I.S Meal Train Ministry – As Maria Dorn presented at the March 3rd meeting, the purpose of this new ministry is to provide meals for a limited time to H.I.S. members in need of assistance during unforeseen circumstances to supplement meals they are already receiving from family and friends.

When someone identifies a H.I.S. member who needs meal assistance, they will reach out to the Organizer (a member of the H.I.S. Board of Directors), who will work with you

to get the process started. This meal train is managed through a website and volunteers will receive emails notifying them of a need for meals. Volunteers will be able to access the site through the email by clicking on the link and the name of the individual and a summary of what they need and when they need it will be explained. Volunteers will then pick a date on the calendar that they could provide a meal. If you are not able to provide a meal at the time you receive the email, you simply ignore the request. The Organizer will be notified via email of all activity and the volunteer will be reminded via email of the date you committed your meal.

<u>To get this train out of the station, we need 20 volunteers</u>. If you are willing to provide a meal now and then, please put your name, phone # and email address on the volunteer list going around today. RECIPE OF THE MONTH - Submitted By: Theresa Bichsel

Kíng Arthur Cream Cheese Scones - Served at Holy Infant Advent Tea Yíelds: 14 - 18 two ínch scones

Ingredients

- 3¹/₄ cup King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour (452 grams)
- ¹/₂ cup granulated sugar
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- ¹/₂ teaspoon salt
- 8 oz. cream cheese (COLD)
- ¹/₂ cup butter (COLD)
- 1 large egg
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- ¼ cup whole milk



1. PREHEAT OVEN to 375°F. 350°F for Convection oven.

2. Blend dry ingredients in food processor. Cut in cream cheese and butter into dry ingredients in food processor pulsing until pea size lumps are dispersed among flour. Empty mixture into large bowl.

3. Whisk together egg, vanilla & milk. Add this mixture to dry mixture and mix minimally.

4. Turn dough out onto floured surface and pat to 1 inch thickness. Cut out 2 inch round biscuits or cut into squares or triangles. Place on parchment covered baking sheet, brush tops of scones with milk or cream and sprinkle coarse sugar on top.

5. Bake 16-18 minutes at 375°F regular oven/less in convection oven or until bottom of scone is lightly browned. (Tops don't brown unless baked in convection oven).

6. Let cool before freezing, for use later or eat warm with jam and sweetened whipped cream.
