Member of the Month - Pauline Nocifora

PAULINE NOCIFORA comes from a family of 5 boys and 2 girls. Originally from Cleveland Ohio, she moved to St. Louis in 1977. Most of Pauline's life, she was in Banking and really enjoyed it and the many clients she had. She has done Dietary and Bookkeeping too, but now she is taking it easy and 'just' volunteers.

When she came to Holy Infant, Pauline jumped right in to service our parish. From participating in Small Church Group, cleaning the chapel and changing candles for 17 years, assisting Fr. Ebert and Fr. Bannes as an Alter Server, Ushering, serving as Eucharistic Minister & Greeter, In Angel Corps, and as a Stephen Minister since its inception here. In addition, you will see her working at the Men's Fish Fry, St. Pat's Day, the Spring Festival and, of course, the Rummage Sale. She

is also in the Senior group and has sold the 50-50-tickets there.

Her passion is Square and Round Dancing. She belonged to 2 clubs, the Swingin' Singles, now Singles & Doubles and Rafter Rockers, where she served as Vice President and Treasurer. Then she was Vice President, President and Treasurer of the Federation which included 52 Clubs. She served as Treasurer of the Federation for 15 years. During that time, the Federation always had a Benefit each year for a nonprofit organization. She chaired 3 of them, 1 for Ronald McDonald House, 1 for NAMI and 1 for Independence Center.

Then was her big event, The 42nd National Square Dance Convention which brought to St Louis over 18,600 dancers in June of 1993 from all over the United States and the Countries. Remember the flood? Wow, that was really close for them on the timing. She was chosen to be Vice Chairman of Ways & Means, so she had lots of fun thinking of the many ways she could raise money for the event. They started 5 years prior to the event and traveled to many states. She got to be in the Fashion Show when they went to Salt Lake City, Utah. She enjoyed Anaheim, California and the fact that Disneyland stayed open for ONLY Square Dancers from 12:00 A.M. to 4:00 A.M. She only lasted till 3:00 because they were flying home at 6:00 A.M. She also enjoyed other places like Canada, Texas, Tennessee, etc. She got to dance on stage at the Muny during intermission when Oklahoma played and danced under the Arch, etc. So much fun, doing so much, going to so many places, meeting so many people, being in the Newspaper with the recipes from the Cookbook they made, touring St Louis, dancing on television, etc. Some of the very best years of her life. She says she can't dance 6 nights a week and work anymore.

After her mother passed away in 1998, her lovely sister, Angelina, came to live with her while she worked at Independence Center. After 1 1/2 years, Angelina had a stroke and since Pauline was working full time, her sister went to a nursing home, and passed away in 2018. Pauline visited her after the 6:00 Mass and after work every day. Angelina loved everyone and still has friends at Independence Center who still contact Pauline.



RECIPE OF THE MONTH -Chocolate Zucchíní cake or muffins

- Make <u>sour milk*</u> first and <u>set aside</u>: ¹/₂ CUP **MILK** + ¹/₂ TSP. **VINEGAR**
- 2. Mix together:
 ¹/₂ CUP SMART BALANCE, SOFTENED
 ¹/₂ CUP OIL (try ¹/₄ cup to ¹/₂ cup natural apple sauce instead)
 1-3/4 CUP SUGAR
 2 EGGS
 1 TSP. VANILLA
- 3. Add Sour Milk*
- 4. Add Dry Ingredients:
 2-1/2 CUP FLOUR
 4 TSP. COCOA
 1 TSP. BAKING SODA
 1 TBSP. BROWN SUGAR
 ¹/₂ TSP. CINNAMON
 ¹/₂ TSP. SALT
- 5. Mix in:2 CUPS SHREDDED ZUCCHINI
- Mix together and put on top of muffins or cake before baking ¹/₂ CUP BROWN SUGAR, ¹ CUP CHOCOLATE CHIPS ¹ CUP CHOPPED PECANS


For cake, use 9X13" cake pan and bake at 350 degrees for 45 Minutes

30 CUPCAKES BAKING TIME: 325 DEGREES FOR 25 MINUTES!

Bake 16-18 minutes at 375°F regular oven/less in convection oven or until bottom of scone is lightly browned. (Tops don't brown unless baked in convection oven).

Let cool before freezing, for use later or eat warm with jam and sweetened whipped cream.

To warm, microwave for 10 seconds, peel off the cupcake wrapper and microwave for another 12 seconds. Delicious and Moist!!
