Member of the month - Monsignor Dieckmann

Greetings fellow Seniors. I received a request from Maria Dorn to write a short bio for the HIS Newsletter, so here goes. I was born in April, 1948, the firstborn of Keith and Audrey Dieckmann. I was followed by three sisters: Cheryl, Pam, and

Donna; and by three brothers: Keith, Rick and Ken. Sadly, my dad passed away in October of 1973 and my brother Rick in October, 2016.

At first, we lived in a duplex on Ray Avenue, not far from the Granada Theater. My maternal grandfather was a contractor and built many brick homes in south St. Louis so it wasn't surprising that he and my dad built our house on Salzburger which was our home from 1951 until 1970. While I was working at Camp Richards outside Milwaukee the family moved to a house on Rhodes Avenue not far down the street from Our Lady of Sorrows parish. Luckily, they let me know that they moved in my absence.

While those were my family's physical homes our spiritual homes have been St. John the Baptist and Our Lady of Sorrows. OLS has been so very important in my family's life. The kids all went to school there, received our sacraments there, and mom was one of the parish secretaries for over 49 years. Mom and two of my sisters still call OLS "home."

I'm what's known in seminary parlance as a "lifer", meaning I started my seminary education right after grade school. St. Louis Prep South (1962 – 66), Cardinal Glennon college (1966 – 70), and Kenrick Seminary (1970 – 74) and was ordained a priest on May 18, 1974.

One of my proudest achievements is that I've had very few assignments over the years. Associate Pastor at St. Raphael (74-80), St. Anthony in High Ridge (1980 – 86), and Annunciation in Webster Groves (1986 – 92). I've served as Pastor at Good Shepherd in Hillsboro (1992 – 2000) and St. Paul in Fenton (2000 – 18). As you know I came here to Holy Infant as Senior Priest in Service in June of 2018. Cardinal Burke named me a Monsignor in September of 2008, much to the surprise of no one except my mom.

I've had lots of hobbies to keep me busy over the years: astronomy, science, photography (before phones became cameras), trading card collector of the non-sport variety, reading books about Scripture, science fiction and science fact, amassing record albums and gigabytes of music files, playing guitar in a folk group (April's Children) and bass in a rock group (The Origin of Species). My favorite hobby is Amateur Radio (call sign KAoIAR) although I'm not as active as I used to be. For now, I concentrate on travel, mostly cruises.

That's most likely more than you really wanted to know. However, if you want more ask me sometime about my one date with a girl or my experience with the New Year's Eve tornado of 2010. God bless.


Is a Loved One Facing a Transition?
