

November 8, 2016 General Election – Absentee Voting

Absentee Voting in person for the November 8, 2016 General Election will be held at a new location, 3232 Laclede Station Road in the Deer Creek Shopping Plaza. The first day for absentee voting is Tuesday September 27, 2016 at 8:00 a.m.

<u>Voting Hours In Person:</u> Absentee voting for the November General Election begins on Tuesday, September 27, 2016 and will remain open, Monday through Friday, during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

<u>Saturday Hours:</u> Absentee voting will also be available four Saturdays prior to the election. Absentee voting, at 3232 Laclede Station Road, will be available from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on the following Saturdays: October 15, 22, 29; and **November 5**

# RECIPE OF THE MONTH HEINE RELISH (pronounced HINEY)

#### INGREDIENTS:

2 bags of fresh cranberries
2 oranges
2 tart apples
¼ cup granulated sugar (or to taste)
6 oz. of red jello (any flavor)
(In liquid form after following Jello directions-this)

# DIRECTIONS:

Cut oranges and apples into one inch pieces, Remove seeds, but not peelings.

is added for the setting process)

Fill the hand crank grinder with cranberries, adding 2 pieces of apples and oranges on top. Grind mixture and repeat until all cranberries and fruit are used.

Grind this mixture into a casserole dish, using another dish to catch the liquid from the mixture. (NOTE: Add sugar to this juice and pour into a bottle – the yummiest cranberry juice ever!) After grinding all, stir to mix evenly; sprinkle with sugar and mix; add liquid Jello and mix well. Place casserole of relish in refrigerator to set. Can be made 1-2 days before Thanksgiving to develop flavors and lasts indefinitely.

[If you do not have a hand food grinder; perhaps a food processor would substitute.
You want to maintain a coarse texture to the relish.]

## The story behind the recipe:

Making the relish was Daddy's job at Thanksgiving and if you've ever used a hand crank food grinder, you know it has to be clamped to something to stay secure during the grinding process. For this tradition, we used a small little stool that was handmade by Daddy's Dad so it had a history of good times! But with the pressure of turning the crank, the darn stool kept flipping up. So to solve that problem, Daddy called little Denis (our two year old) "hey, Denis, help me hold this still, sit your heine on the bench" and thus a new tradition was added to the cranberry relish/now called HEINE RELISH!
